

**Lyn Dickason author *The Estate***

Born in a small village in Wales to RAF parents who moved to the seaside city of Port Elizabeth, Africa when Lyn, an only child, was a toddler. Writing, art and animals were always a passion and she has many tales of causing her parents stress by antics like buying a donkey from a pedlar and keeping it in the suburban back yard, chickens roosting on the piano or escaping in the kitchen. Life at an academic private school was a penance as Lyn's heart was in writing poetry about imaginary brothers or building Papier Mache models. As an adult she painted murals for an international hotel group and designed and built stage sets for schools. Having been a Sea Ranger in her teens, Lyn met Peter who was in the Navy at the time and within a few years they were married and eventually settled back in the countryside of Port Elizabeth which is where they raised their three children. They lived there very happily and Lyn even had a strawberry farm which supplied a vast number of outlets. Her passion then was running the farm school which they had set up, and they were involved with a number of other outreach programs for the local African families such as helping with setting up businesses, enabling literacy, first aid and fire-fighting courses, teaching knitting and sewing and running a soccer club. She managed the local farm school for thirty years, and even organised the fundraising to enable the children to go on trips and experiences and sports outings. In 2010 with all three children settled in Australia and feeling that they had done as much as they could to make a difference in their local community, Lyn and Peter moved to Australia and settled in the Adelaide Hills. Lyn, always passionate about writing became a writing instructor for the University of the Third Age (U3A) and has inspired several others to also become authors. A couple of years ago she wrote a book on the **history of the Lobethal Harmony Club. *The Estate* is her first murder mystery novel.**
